In the 3rd quarter, we experienced 21 terminations and assigned 18 spaces. Our turnover ratio decreased slightly from 3.92% in 2022 to 3.17% in 2023.

The waitlist has 333 total applications on file (compared to 343 in the 3rd quarter of 2022).

Dry Storage

Dry storage had a 92.4% occupancy at quarter-end, which is 6% less than the 3rd quarter of 2022. 52 trailers are currently being stored in the Dry Storage Facility compared to 59 in 3rd quarter of 2022.

Total boat handling moves by the forklifts this quarter were 4921

- 5.4% decrease from the 3rd quarter of 2023
- Launch activity was down 12% from the 3rd quarter of 2022

The launch reservation usage was down 2% from the 3rd quarter of 2022.

• Reservations are required during all operating hours

Equipment updates and repairs.

- Forklift repairs: The Wiggins forklift had DEF alarm sensor replaced.
- Launcher repairs: The North and South launcher had guide wheels greased all summer due to loud noise.
- The staff has maintained the launchers and forklifts this quarter per the maintenance schedule with assistance from the Maintenance Department. The team has maintained the wash pad area daily (rinsing it off), turned the valve, and cleaned the trench bucket weekly.

Public Launch

Round trips in the 3rd quarter of 2023 show an 8% increase from 2022

• 154 more round trips in 2023

One-way launches show a decrease of 10% from 2022

• 28 fewer one-way trips in 2023

Guest Moorage

The total number of boats increased by 6% (118 boats), and the total number of nights increased by 2% (71 nights) during the 3rd quarter of 2023.

There were 44 reservations during the 3rd quarter of 2023: the same amount as 3rd quarter of 2022. The reservation program accounted for 70 nights in the 3rd quarter of 2023 compared to 58 nights in the 3rd quarter of 2022.
